

Freedom of Information Act (FOIA)

Often described as a means for the public to know "what their Government is up to."

Key provisions:

- Requires agencies to proactively disclose key information, including frequently requested records.
- Affords any member of the public the right to request access to government records, along with rights to administrative and judicial review.
 Delineates discrete categories of information that are exempt from mandatory release.

Over 100 agencies are subject to the FOIA and are required to:

- Designate a Chief FOIA Officer at the Assistant Secretary level or equivalent
- Maintain their own FOIA website
- Establish procedures for processing requests and appeals
- Make proactive disclosures

Department of Justice (DOJ), Office of Information Policy (OIP)

OIP's mission is to encourage and oversee agency compliance with the FOIA. We accomplish this by:

- Developing government-wide <u>policy guidance</u> on all aspects of FOIA administration;
- Providing <u>legal counsel</u> and training to agency personnel, including <u>real-time</u>, <u>on-demand</u>, and <u>agency-specific</u> training courses;
- Publishing a range of resources, including the <u>DOJ Guide to the FOIA</u>, <u>Court Decision</u> <u>summaries</u>, <u>Exemption 3</u> resources, and <u>Self-Assessment Toolkit</u>; and,
- Overseeing agency compliance with FOIA reporting requirements, including the <u>Annual FOIA</u> <u>Report</u>, <u>Quarterly Reports</u>, and <u>Chief FOIA Officers Reports</u>, and publishing <u>summaries</u> and <u>assessments</u> of these reports.
- Administering the National FOIA Portal on <u>FOIA.gov</u>, including overseeing agency compliance with the <u>interoperability requirements</u>.

OIP also manages the DOJ's obligations under FOIA, including adjudicating administrative appeals of access determinations made by DOJ components, handling initial requests for records for senior management offices, and completing the annual <u>DOJ FOIA Litigation and Compliance Report</u>.




